

Lillian "Beadsie" Woo is a Senior Fellow in the Annie E. Casey Foundation at Baltimore, MD.

Ms. Woo is co-author of CFED's *Subsidies for Assets: A New Look at the Federal Budget* with Dave Buchholz, *Development Finance and Regional Economic Development* with Andrea Levere and Bill Schweke, *Job Creation Alternatives in North Carolina* with William Schweke and *Hidden in Plain Sight: A look at the \$335 billion federal asset-building budget* with William Schweke and David Buchholz. Additionally, she serves as a member of the Taxpayer Advocacy Panel (TAP), a citizen advisory group to the IRS; TAP members are appointed by the U.S. Secretary of the Treasury and help the IRS improve customer service and satisfaction.

Ms. Woo's previous experience with economic development has been in the international context. Doing field work in Sri Lanka and in Malaysia, under the auspices of the Luce Scholars program, Ms. Woo worked on policies and projects designed to create opportunities for rural communities. Returning from Asia, she worked at the International Food Policy Research Institute, organizing an international conference on poverty research, and the World Bank, serving as primary analyst of Malaysia's New Economic Policy. Ms. Woo has a bachelor's in economics from Davidson College, a Master of Public Policy from Harvard University, and a doctorate in economics from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
